Join a small group this Fall!

They go by different names—small groups, cell groups, care groups, discipleship groups. Whatever they are called, the basic idea is the same: a small gathering of people interested in spiritual growth.

Small groups are a valuable means of helping people in churches foster a deeper sense of community. As we amalgamate with the congregation of Westbank United and Central Okanagan United continues to grow, we are hoping to provide lots of opportunities this Fall for people to get to know one another. Monthly potluck lunches on the last Sunday of every month, fundraisers, and a new photo directory are some of the ways we can foster connections. And we invite you to consider joining a small group this Fall to meet some new friends and nurture your own spiritual growth!





Walk and Talk is a program, developed by Dr Charlotte Jones, of UBCO, to meet the identified needs of seniors for socialization, physical fitness and health education. The program consists of three parts: a half hour walk in historic downtown Kelowna, a half hour of exercises developed by the University of Otaga in New Zealand, designed specifically to strengthen the muscles that are most useful in improving balance and preventing falls; and a time for socialization. Everyone walks at their own pace with whatever mobility aids they are most comfortable using. The exercises improve your mobility, balance, and muscle strengthen. There is an increasing body of knowledge concerning the health risks associated with social isolation. The group chooses the topics for the discussion time. We will start the program mid September and meet twice a week eight to ten weeks. This program is designed for seniors of all physical abilities. Please consider joining us.




GETTING THE MOST OUT OF YOUR SENIOR YEARS


COUC Agíng Study Group

Outreach

Tuesday Outreach continues to grow in numbers as more people join us for a meal and to get some groceries. Demand varies each week and often gets heavier near each month end.

Our food cupboard has gone from bare to abundant! Individual donations of supplies have increased markedly, making a real difference on our shelves. Numbers of recipients have dropped down a bit, from a high of 63 to an average of around 40 every Tuesday, with a few others helped during the week. Our board has also increased our budget (we'll be able to help with homeless prevention and other needs too), allowing us to take advantage of case-lot sales to replenish supplies of canned fruit, cereals and etc. As a result we are pleased to be able to return to people picking up 10 items of their choosing every Tuesday (along with lunch).

Folk coming from West Bank United tell us they have a tradition of bringing food bank items to church on the first Sunday of the month. We would like to continue this generosity, so please plan to bring your items on the first Sunday of the month. It works well with communion Sunday and the sense that we are all fed at Christ's table. Please continue bringing what you can to our common table, you are making a huge difference in many lives. As we look towards the Autumn months, and Thanksgiving, we hope to encourage this season to be a time to give and share within our community.

While it is rewarding to see how this Outreach is filling a need and how greatly appreciated it is by the various members of the community (the homeless, those in transitional housing, or those who have a place to live but not enough money to afford groceries), it is at the same time often a very humbling experience for the volunteers.

It is on a Tuesday morning when you realize just how blessed you are to have everything you need to live a comfortable life: a safe home, a comfortable bed, healthy and delicious food, clean clothing, and family and friends surrounding you.

Our weekly offerings to the visitors of our Food Cupboard include items such as: Meat/Protein: canned tuna, chicken, ham, pork & beans, chili, Chef Boyardee; and peanut butter Other Items: canned soup, vegetables, fruit; boxes of cereal; individual-serving oatmeal packets; pasta and pasta sauces; Mac & Cheese; Mr. Noodle; Premium Saltine Crackers; individual fruit cups; granola bars; coffee and brown and white sugar (we split the larger containers into smaller lots for distribution); and toilet paper Pop and juice boxes for lunches would also be appreciated, and sandwiches and cookies are always welcome.

Ministry & Personelle Committee (M&P)

Hello, everyone! Your M&P Committee has been tasked to describe "Who We Are" in this edition of the August newsletter. There are several pages in "The Manual" of the United Church of Canada that outline the policies, procedures, and practices that must be followed by the committee in carrying out its responsibilities, but we'll simply provide an overview today, and add some comments about how we're involved with the Ministry Profile and Search (MPS) Committee (aka Search Team)

The M&P Committee functions around three roles, which are the consultative and supportive role, the healthy relationships role, and the supervisory role. We provide resources and support for the staff and the community of faith with respect to any issue affecting staff of our church, including ministry personnel and lay employees. The committee works to build positive and trusting relationships between staff and members and adherents of the community of faith. This naturally means that confidentiality is key in our relationships, but we also strive to be as transparent as possible. And whenever congregants have praise or concerns about any of our staff members, we ask that you share them with your M&P Committee through signed correspondence, so that we can consider the issues confidentially and recommend appropriate action.

A few questions have been asked about the M&P role in the establishment and operation of the Search Team. Essentially, we were only involved in the recruitment of its members, and in helping to set up their first meeting. As it turned out, we were very fortunate in being able to recruit the new search team very quickly. This team has an abundance of experience, knowledge, and enthusiasm, and will represent all ages of our congregation in exemplary fashion! We wish them the same success in calling or appointing a new minister (If approved) as M&P enjoyed in recruiting them to the MPS Team!

M&P is also responsible for including any new staff positions in the annual budget. The COUC budget deliberations for 2024 will soon be upon us, and we want to assure you that M&P recognizes the need for financial prudence. We all see first-hand that we are blessed with an amazing staff that is doing a remarkable job of helping us to achieve the goals and objectives that COUC set at amalgamation.

Ultimately, it will help our church to broaden our stated Mission for our church family and our wider community!


Strengthening Voices. Inspiring Possibility. WHERE VOICES COME TO LIFE
