





Tuesday Morning Coffee, Social Time, Meal and Grocery Distribution

Well, I still do not have a new name to announce for our Tuesday Morning Coffee, Social Time, Meal and Grocery Distribution. We are still waiting for that one incredible spark to ignite our imaginations. But in the meantime, our service to the community continues each week. In November we continued distributing about 55 bags of groceries and feeding 60+ people every Tuesday.

In December, the first two Tuesdays will be our usual offerings, but we are planning a special full turkey dinner for our guests on Tuesday, December 19th - the last Tuesday we are open until the new year. If you would be interested in being involved with the prep or baking for this special turkey dinner, please let me know.

In 2024, we will continue with our regular Tuesday morning service and we will have a special event sometime around mid to late January. Some consider this part of year, with the Christmas and New Year's festivities and visiting over, the bills to pay for all the past festivities coming due, and the cold dark dreary days of winter continuing, to be a very depressing time. So we are going to try and liven things up and cheer up our neighbours in the process. No decisions have been made yet on the exact format so we are looking for all suggestions. Music? Games? Hot chocolate and cookies? A dinner? We are open to all ideas.

This new event later in January will replace the former New Year's Day Dinner that has been held for many years at the Bernard site. The timing of that event, on January 1st, was considered problematic with the office being closed between Christmas and New Year's, people away on holidays or at home entertaining company, etc. Also, there are many other community events throughout the holiday season and we felt doing something a bit later would be more beneficial to the members of our community. We will keep you posted as we develop ideas for this special event while honouring the New Year's Day Dinner events of the past.

I must say a big year-end thank you to the many countless volunteers that make our Tuesday morning program possible, and that includes so many of you who cook the food, make sandwiches, serve the meals, bake desserts, do dishes, buy groceries for the Food Pantry, and so many more. We definitely could not offer this program without the help of so many willing individuals. You are all truly "blessed to be a blessing" and we wish you all health and happiness this holiday season. Worship is a mainstay in the life of any Community of Faith. We are all familiar with the standard **10:00 am Sunday worship**. A time filled with music, prayer, and preaching, reminding us of our call to community and action. But did you know, that here at COUC, we have other opportunities for worship?

Morning Sharing Circle: 8am Sundays

Richard Wagamese writes about the grace that comes to participants in sharing circles, where we bring what we need and receive what is there for us. Keith is offering an opportunity for a circle based in that form of communal sacred presence. These circles offer opportunities for spiritual nourishment grown out of the sharing circles Keith encountered as a diaconal student at the Centre for Christian Studies. There is singing, praying, a reading, communal reflection time, more prayer and more singing.

Lydia Circle: 6pm Thursdays (6pm Tuesdays beginning in January)

There are at least twenty-six references in the New Testament that talk about believers meeting in homes or being part of a household. One of these "house churches" gathered in the home of Lydia of Thyatira, whose story is told in Philippians (Acts 16:14). Homes are usually comfortable places—places devoid of pews, hymnals and PA systems. They are places where people can open up, listen, learn, and grow. This group meets at the church but each group member takes responsibility for providing and hosting the meal for one week. We eat together, open the Bible together, discuss our beliefs, pray and have Communion together.

This group is limited in size to 8-10 members and is open to all genders.

A Time Apart – Contemplative Labyrinth Walk: Wednesdays in the Fellowship Hall

Sometimes we need a time apart, a time to be in quiet reflection. Labyrinth walking is a spiritual practice to quiet, center, and allow contemplation and prayer. Beginning in Advent (Wednesday, November 29th) Ivy will be facilitating a contemplative labyrinth walk, including instruction for those who are experiencing the labyrinth for the first time. The schedule for these walks through December is as follows:

Wednesdays Nov. 29, Dec 6, 13 & 20 @ 7:30-8:30 am
