



Yet another year of change and direction setting! Who would have thought it?

I suppose the correct answer is 'Almost anyone who has been on the planet any amount of time, especially lately.'

We see change all around us: disruptions in earth, sea, air and in many of our solid, reliable, dependable systems. Why would our church be any different? Nationally our church is exploring ways to decolonize, including respecting the request of the Indigenous Church for full and meaningful autonomy. Regionally our church continues to seek ways to live out its call to support congregations, ministries and leaders with tangible, meaningful resource allocations, while figuring out how to help those who have share with those who have not. Locally we have our own changes to consider.

Reverend Ivy Thomas has announced her retirement, setting the date for the end of July, just about the time Cheryl Perry, our Pastoral Care Minister, returns from her 6 month leave of absence. Our posting for an Intergenerational Minister closes at the end of February, while a posting for a new Worship Minister might be in place by the end of January. We could be welcoming new ministry personnel by late summer or early fall. Bringing their own experiences and approaches.

In the meantime we will be setting our sights on, well...our sites. How best can they serve the needs of congregation and the community? A natural next step following the development of our Amalgamation Plan (2021) and our Ministry Plan (2023). We hope to have a well-defined sense of the physical infrastructure needed to meet the needs of congregation and community, with an indication of who we might partner with to put it in place. Our board is hard at work developing a facilities/partnership plan and will be seeking advice periodically to chart a course.

In all of this it is good to remember who we are and whose we are. We are part of a more than 2000-year-old tradition, following the teachings of the One we know as the Son of God, who came to remind us that institutions and institutionalization are not divine. Even if we think they are. Institutions and individuals do not have a corner on the presence of God in our lives and our being. Our rites and rituals, traditions and practices can evoke God in our lives, although even they dry up for some, while feeding others.

We have, in some ways been an ever-changing, ever-evolving tradition, doing our best to follow Christ's teachings with faithful adherence to the call to love G*d with all of our heart, mind, spirit and strength. Holding fast to that presence while the Creating currents of change wear away at institutions and understandings. As we navigate 2024 together, may faith be our companion and guide. May we trust in Love's insistence to beckon us on and hold us well. Even as tempests roll and rivers rage.

It is good to be on the journey together, adding our efforts and energy to the New Creation that is, even now, being birthed among us.

A 4000 Ending

Join us for a series of conversations intended to provoke thinking and conversation on what constitutes a good ending for ourselves and those we care for who are approaching the end of their life. Thursdays January 11, 18, 25, and Feb 1 from 9:30-11:00am at the Bernard site.



January 11 - What is a good ending? What do we hope for the end of our lives (and beyond)? What are our beliefs about life after death? In a time when there are medical interventions to prolong life that weren't available in past generations, how do we define quality of life and approach ethical questions and decisions such as when to end life support? This session will touch on the role of hospice, and define terms such as euthanasia, medical assistance in dying, and palliative care.

January 18 - Practical Matters: The Personal Stuff As we consider what legacy we wish to leave to others, there are practical matters to consider such as gifting things of value and recording our memories. We will draw on the wisdom of The Gentle Art of Swedish Death Cleaning, a radical and joyous guide written by eighty-something Margareta Magnusson, who outlines how to de-clutter our lives, take stock of what's important, and make our lives as stress-free as possible.

January 25 - Practical Matters: The Legal Stuff Often referred to as "getting our affairs in order," there are practical matters to planning for a good ending. This session will touch on both the practical and spiritual aspects of wills, planned giving, and define terms such as Power of Attorney, Substitute Decision Makers, advance care planning, DNR.

February 1 – Honouring a Life: Planning A Service of Celebration Reflecting on our faith and what is important to us, expressing our wishes to family, and the practical steps of preplanning and prepaying funeral arrangements. This session will explore scripture, ritual, define terms such as funeral/celebration of life, and offer practical guidance in planning your own service.

Tuesday Morning Coffee, Social Time, Meal and Grocery Distribution





Another year has come and gone and we must look back and be proud of all that was accomplished and look ahead with excitement and anticipation for what is to come. The pictures above are of the turkey dinner we served to our guests on Tuesday, December 19th, the last day we were open in 2023. At least 75 guests joined us for fellowship, a delicious meal, Christmas carol singing, and treats; and 65 bags of groceries were handed out. Our volunteers were busy all morning!

Thank you to all the volunteers who worked that morning to make everything run so smoothly for our guests, and thank you to another group of individuals who provided food for the meal. Thank you also to all the congregation members who donated goods for our food pantry on "plain gift" Sunday and throughout the entire year. Without the support of so many people, we would not be able to run this program.

In terms of what we handed out this year, in total we distributed over 2,000 bags of groceries with toilet paper, canned fruit, and fruit cups being the most popular items. Chef Boyardee, chilli, and canned meat (ham or chicken) were close behind with over 1,000 of each item distributed. With the help of your generous contributions of non-perishable items, we were able to stay within our originally approved budget despite the rising cost of food.

In 2024, we will continue with our regular Tuesday morning program and we will have a special event on January 20th. See elsewhere in this newsletter for more details on that event and how you can get involved. And if you would like to be involved with our regular Tuesday mornings, please feel free to contact me. We are always looking for volunteers to help cook meals, do baking, make sandwiches, do dishes, shop, serve meals, bag groceries, visit, and so much more.


