Becoming an Anti-racism & De-colonizing Community of Faith

A Lenten Practice to Engage With

Throughout the 40 days of Lent, we will be focusing on De-colonization and Anti-racism. Yes, the two do indeed go hand in hand.

What do we say, or not say, to a racialized person?
As a racialized person, how do I respond to the challenges this presents?
How does our place in society reflect colonization and why does it matter?
What steps can we take to assist in breaking through the injustices?

These are all key questions to be asking ourselves and wrestling with. Believe it or not, Jesus and the Prophets wrestled with ones a lot like them. What did being a 'chosen person' mean? Who spoke truth to wealth and power? What happened? The United Church of Canada, General Council has provided us with some excellent stories, insights and wisdom to help us along our way. We encourage you to join the journey.

Each day through lent, you can go to this link and find resources to help you reflect on various aspects of anti-racism and decolonization. You are invited to read one a day and spend a little time in reflection. Jot down your thoughts and question and be ready to discuss them over coffee time in a very informal setting.

On Saturday, January 20th we held our annual New Year's Dinner and it was a wonderful time of fellowship, food and fun. About 90 individuals enjoyed the fantastic meal prepared and provided by volunteers from Central Okanagan United Church.

Over 65 volunteers were involved in total doing various jobs such as cooking beef, ham or potatoes, making coleslaw or dessert, setting tables, carving meat, serving food, hosting tables, providing entertainment, doing cleanup and dishes and a multitude of other tasks.

I want to thank everyone who volunteered as you made the organizational job so easy this year. All positions were covered and not a single arm had to be twisted. And any items we had to buy were covered by donations from those who could not help at the event, so the meal cost the church virtually nothing. Your overwhelming support and willingness to help were deeply appreciated.

Our guests really enjoyed the evening and they were still talking about it on Tuesday while they enjoyed the leftovers from the event. The meal was fantastic but they also really appreciated the time to sit and visit and play games and meet some new people. We received so many words of gratitude that must be passed on to all who contributed to making the evening a success.

The picture below was taken after last Tuesday morning's session when we handed out 65 bags of groceries. We had some peanut butter left but only because Jayne and Susanne got their wires crossed and both bought some. Otherwise, there was one lonely can of tuna left and everything else on that side of the room was gone. And the bins on the other side of the room were either empty or had just a few items left. As a result, we could not fill all requests.

Our numbers are generally up, providing meals for an average of 60 people and groceries for close to 70. We note an increase in requests from people who have come to Canada seeking refuge, from Ukraine, parts of the former Soviet Union and Africa – who's federal support allotments are not enough to provide all their needs. Some of our friends from pre–Covid years have returned after a long absence as income supports have dropped off, while the cost of food and housing has increased dramatically.

Now that the Christmas break is behind us, we will return to our routine of asking for donations for the Food Pantry on the last Sunday of every month. On the Sunday when we all share the abundance of the Lord's Table, and we all come together to share a potluck luncheon, we ask you to share your bounty with others in our community. The following items are what we offer to our guests weekly and if you can contribute any of these items it would be greatly appreciated.

Canned fruit, vegetables, chilli, tuna, ham, chicken, soups, beans, and Chef Boyardee meat pastas

Cereal, oatmeal packets, fruit cups, pasta, pasta sauce, crackers, peanut butter, coffee,

sugar, mac & cheese, Mr. Noodle, granola bars And of course, the ever-popular toilet paper

"Honouring a Life: Planning A Service of Celebration"




February 8th, 9:30am-11am




