

### Giving and PAR



Do you remember when everyone received a box of little envelopes at the beginning of each year and then everyone put one of those envelopes into the collection plate every Sunday, and virtually all the contributions to the church were made this way? Boy, have things changed! We don't even use collection plates anymore.

First there was the development of the Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR) program, which started back in 1976 and many contributors signed up for PAR because of the convenience and the guarantee of regular monthly contributions. Then platforms like CanadaHelps appeared in 2000, and e-transfers started after 2003. Some folks preferred to make gifts of shares instead of cash, to help their tax situation; and now we even have QR codes in the church pews!

While the many options for giving certainly existed prior to Covid 19, it was the pandemic and related lockdown that really changed how contributions were made to churches as many individuals recognized that the expenses of the church continued during the pandemic and they wanted to support the church even if they couldn't attend worship services in person.

Today, Central Okanagan United Church receives about 49% of its contributions through monthly PAR. Another 39% come through cash/cheques/e-transfers that arrive weekly, monthly or just occasionally; and 12% comes through the other giving platforms – mostly in the form of shares.

No matter how it arrives, COUC greatly appreciates your contributions and makes good use of them through its four ministries and varied programming with about 29% going toward Worship & Music Ministry, 23% to Community Ministry, 14% to Pastoral Care Ministry and 13% to Intergenerational Ministry. The remaining 21% represents the administration costs of the Bernard office including administrative staffing, office supplies and equipment leases, professional fees, licences and fees, interest and bank charges, facility costs, etc.

Regardless of how you give, COUC thanks you for your continued support and your contributions to COUC ministries and their programming.

#### **PAR Month - Thank you!**

I know that many of you are going to miss those hilarious PAR skits at the beginning of each service but it is now June and not May and, as Porky Pig says, "that's all folks!" #### **How to Participate**

- 1. Prayerfully decide what you will give each year, and divide that amount by 12.
- 2. Fill out the authorization form, and attach a cheque marked "VOID."
- 3. Give this to our designated PAR contact person, or leave at the church office.
- 4. The amount will be transferred from your account to our congregation's account on the 20th of each month. You can modify or cancel your donation, change how it is designated, or change your information at any time.



#### Why Participate?


If you have automatic withdrawals from your bank account to pay your bills, taxes, or mortgage, then you already understand the PAR principle.

Your giving also supports the Mission and Service fund of the United Church of Canada and its work at home and abroad through its many vibrant and vital ministries for the healing of the world. COUC currently gives \$33,000 annually to UCC Mission and Service.

Tuesday mornings continue to be busy with meals being served to approximately 90 individuals and 70 to 80 families regularly asking for a bag of groceries.

Our volunteers (shoppers, cooks, servers, sandwich makers, bakers, grocery baggers, greeters) are kept very busy each week trying to meet these requirements.

As summer weather and sunshine arrive, we are getting requests for sunscreen and bottled water so please keep that in mind if you are out shopping for us. Ad if you have any new or lightly used summer hats or caps you don't know what to do with, we could probably use them.

We appreciate the support from so many of you who contribute money or groceries for the food pantry or goodies for our meals; and thank you for answering our recent appeal for personal hygiene items like toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, deodorant, etc. A need always exists for these items. We are also always in need of reusable bags for packing groceries and for small clean plastic bags like bread bags so we can divide bread and other produce we receive.

We are so blessed to have such faithful volunteers. Both Susanne and I are away for much of June but our volunteers will carry on without us and I'm sure we will not be missed at all.

The availability of volunteers varies from week to week, and over the summer we often struggle while people are away on vacation or have company. If you would like to be involved in any way, please let me know and I'm sure we will have a place for you.


