Fortunately Mike and Jayne and Michel and other experienced board members, new and ongoing, continue to guide us well. We said farewell to Ivy, who led us so ably in worship and grounded us through the amalgamation.

We added a fond goodbye to Tanya, who expertly conned the administration of our office and coordination of our volunteers while sharing her wisdom and insight as we navigated communal and personal challenges. We are so fortunate to have Delaine take on some of those roles, bringing her social media, design, creativity and organizational gifts to the mix, while Saibun adds to his own duties with a blend of experience, tenacity and willingness to show up and get to work that is an example to all.

As Ivy leaves for grandchildren in Alberta and Tanya heads to children in Victoria, we welcome Ally's special blend of experience, enthusiasm and energy to our Intergenerational Ministry. Travelling across the country from St. Catherines to Kelowna, Ally is a long sought after and welcome addition to our team. He will bring a new perspective and a grounded, thoughtful presence to our ministry together.

We await a Worship Minister as our call goes out into the world and those that know us 'tap shoulders'. In the meantime Cheryl, Keith, Ally and Phillip (our returning student minister) will rely upon the gifts and wisdom of Board and Congregation members as we all learn to sing harmoniously. Helped by the steady assurance and careful attendance of Frances, Sylvia and Jessica who add their own notes of joy and blessing to all we do.

Mahmut, of course, keeps our building intact, shows up every day and takes personal care and charge of our facility. He and we wonder what the future holds, as we continue on the path of building relationship, housing and gathering space with the Metis Community Services Society in Rutland.

All this against a backdrop of Climate Disruption, economic dislocation, waves of trauma affecting our neighbours, unprecedented poverty, astronomical costs of living and political environments that seem to grow further and further away from helping people, well, help people. Perhaps we are all in the midst of social, economic and environmental change. Doing our best to be there for one another as we navigate rapidly rising waters.

It is good to remember that, whatever the seas around us, whatever the crew we sail with, Jesus continues to call us into love and shelter. We continue to respond as we are able.

Community Ministry

The numbers of people seeking help with groceries continue to fluctuate from week to week, although the average seems to be in the high 70s, corresponding well to the numbers coming to share a Tuesday morning meal. We continue to struggle with our budget as grocery prices are beyond belief (no news to anyone reading this, I'm sure) and our shoppers weave from discount to discount, trying to get the best bang for our buck. So far they are more successful than the bulk buying ability of local foodbanks, but it takes a lot of time and effort on their part. Many, many thanks to them! We are keeping up.

Thrift Shop volunteers can also testify to the numbers helped with clothing and other items through our low cost items and voucher programs. Our homeless prevention program, in partnership with other community providers, is part of the solution for folk facing eviction and a life on the streets.

Some have asked about our place in the support network. Are we doing enough to help people cope with high prices and finding alternate sources of food? Can we do something about budgeting and meal planning and food preparation techniques? In a word, yes, we can and yes, in a way, we are.

We are in loose partnership with St. Vincent de Paul and the Salvation Army, both of whom have intake processes working with people around budgeting, available resources and programs they might not be aware of. We are in a limited partnership with Adult Integrated Mental Health Services who are providing a food supplement program for some of our folk who are in very difficult circumstances. We provide space for another 'start-up' – a meal planning, prep and take-home meal project run by a Canadian Mental Health employee who saw the need and looked for a way to address it. We have also secured funding from Women's World Day of Prayer to put on courses that might be of use to folk we serve and folk who serve. So far a foodsafe and first aid program are on the calendar, with other interesting topics on the list. Auto mechanics, anyone?

It is so very good to be part of a community that asks itself not only how to provide 'fish' but how to teach folk to fish in the current climate. While we seem helpless in the face of a disrupted natural environment, incredibly high housing prices and almost obscene food costs, we can and do, in our communal ways, offer at least a hand in system navigation. As I was reminded when I arrived at Central Okanagan United Church, we do not have to do everything, nor do we want to do things others are already doing. We fill our niche, do our piece and try to help weave a net of compassionate, care-filled relationship. Thank you for all you do to respond to Christ's call to love our neighbour as ourself. We are blessed!




Walking the Labyrinth
