

Dear Friends,

Seeds and roots. With a cool winter breeze creating goosebumps on our skin, we are often reminded of the stillness of the season when we notice the bare trees lining our streets and in our backyards. It is common to think of these trees as sleeping, hibernating like the great bear. However, the winter season is when trees undergo their most prominent root growth. They focus their attention away from the sky and sink deeper into the earth, reaching for the nutrients that will help them grow in the coming spring. At the beginning of Advent, I spoke about the seeds of Hope in the coming of the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Grounded in God and with the hope of Christ in our hearts, we enter the new year together as a loving people created in the image of a Creator who gave us this world to explore and experience and live into relationship with.

The Season after Epiphany, which began on January 6 with Epiphany Day, lasts until the beginning of Lent on March 5, 2025. This is a season of "ordinary time" in the church year, marked by the colour green—a symbol of growth. Throughout the season we hear stories of "call" and ministry, beginning with Jesus' baptism in the River Jordan when he sensed God's call in a new way, and including stories of the call of his first disciples and beginning of his ministry in Galilee. Epiphany is also a time for us to consider the calls we feel God making in our hearts and lives. Where are you experiencing the tug of Spirit? How are you being called to respond to God?

If you were in worship on January 5 you may have chosen a star word as you left worship. The tradition of using star words, or "star gifts," is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany and the new year. The idea is that this provides a guiding word for your year. You are encouraged to place this star word somewhere you will see it often to allow consistent reflection on how God has moved through, around, or in connection to that word. We trust that God uses multiple ways to guide us and speak to us. Star words are one such lens that might provide us a way to look for God in our midst, both actively and in hindsight. If you don't come to worship in person, you could contact the church to have yours sent to you!

If you would like to inspire others by sharing a story, reflection, insight, sense of holy guidance, (or even a funny or ironic moment) from your previous Star Word experiences you are encouraged to submit these to Delaine for the newsletter. (We can "anonymize" your stories if you prefer to share them that way.) Please limit your Star Word contributions to a maximum of 50 words.

Prompts for using the star words for daily prayer:

A. Look up the definition of your word, even if it is a word you know well. You may even look into the etymology of the word and how its meaning has changed throughout history. If you drew a non-English word, do as much research as you can into the meaning of the word in its original culture.

B. What does this word remind you of? Does it recall any memories or experiences? How might God be speaking to you through this word?

C. See if you can find your word—or a synonym—in the Bible. What scripture passages can you find? How is the word used in these passages? Are there other scripture passages that remind you of your word?



As 2024 ends and 2025 begins it is time to thank all of you once again for your support of the Tuesday morning Outreach program. Without you and your contributions of time, groceries, sandwiches, food, etc., we would not be able to offer this valuable program for our community.





An extra thank you goes to all those who helped with the special Christmas meal on December 17<sup>th</sup> where we fed almost 150 people. Thank you to all who roasted and carved turkeys, boiled and mashed potatoes, cooked vegetables, made stuffing and gravy and cranberries, baked cookies, served meals, bagged

groceries, washed dishes, put away tables and chairs and helped with clean up. With so many people helping in advance and over 20 volunteers working that morning, it really was an easy meal to offer to our guests and they really appreciated it.

And thank you to all who took tags off the giving tree and donated gift cards, toques, mittens and other needed items. The clothing items went almost immediately. The gift cards – almost \$2,000 worth! – will be distributed to families over the coming months as the need arises.

# 2024 was a remarkably busy year with the number of guests increasing substantially.

At the start of the year, we were handing out 40 to 60 bags of groceries, and by the end of the year we were distributing over 100 bags each week with a high of 124 bags on one Tuesday.

The number of meals served followed a similar trend with 60-80 meals being served in the spring but well over 100 each week in the last part of the year with 148 being our highest number.

And our produce table, which sometimes held very little at the beginning of the year, was truly overflowing with bounty by the end of the year thanks to donations from the Lake Country Food Bank and The Salvation Army.

# What can you do to help in 2025?

- We can always use your extra reusable grocery bags and your donations of groceries.
- We also need twist ties for all the dividing and re-bagging of produce that we do each week.
- Right now, we also need a couple more shoppers who perhaps once a month can run around to various stores and buy specific items needed for the Food Pantry.
- We would also appreciate more sandwich makers who can make a loaf or two of sandwiches once a month for an assigned Tuesday.

Over the Christmas holidays I attended a large and very active church with an incredibly young congregation. One of the questions the guest minister asked at the start of his sermon was, "What would happen if your church closed, regardless of the reason? Would your community notice? Would it make a difference to those to your community?" The question certainly made everyone in our family group reflect on our own individual church communities.

Would Kelowna, specifically the local downtown community, miss COUC if it closed? I certainly believe that COUC would be greatly missed. Where would the support groups that currently rent our facilities go? What would happen to our congregation members who gather for service on Sunday or participate in other activities throughout the week? And what would happen to our Tuesday morning guests who come for a meal or groceries or for some fellowship?

I cannot imagine downtown Kelowna without our regular Outreach programs or our other Community Ministry initiatives such as Affirm, Reconciliation, and Peace and Justice education; and I cannot imagine Kelowna without a United Church or the Central Okanagan Refugee Committee or SongShine. Sure, some of those activities could be picked up by other organizations or moved to other locations, but they are all important to our community and they are all centred and supported by Central Okanagan United Church.

We are doing great things and we are making a difference in our community, and I know we would be missed if we were not here. Our presence is important and every activity that COUC offers fulfills its vision, "To seek, experience, and express God's love together in an open community which embraces diversity and demonstrates by faithful actions the love of God through the teachings of Jesus."

We are living out our beliefs. We are serving God and worshipping together and welcoming all who join us. We are feeding those who are hungry, giving drink to those who are thirsty, providing clothing for those who are in need of clothing, welcoming those who are lonely, and visiting those who are sick. We are demonstrating the love of God in everything we do.

Do you remember the Stewardship Flower we talked about last year? Well, COUC is covering all of those flower pedals: worship, prayer, faith sharing, study, loving service, and generosity. On that last point, COUC is generous in so many ways – just some of which are noted above.

# 2025 (and 2024!) Contributions

The Government of Canada has extended the deadline for making charitable donations eligible for the 2024 tax year, until February 28, 2025. This announcement was made to counter the negative effect of the year-end postal strike on charities.

While very few of the donations we receive come in by mail, the change still affects COUC as a charity so this is how we will be proceeding.

- All donations received by COUC in January and February will be considered donations for the 2025 year
  unless they are specifically designated for 2024. So please, if you want your contribution to count as a 2024
  charitable donation, clearly identify that fact on your cheque or in the note section of your e-transfer or
  somewhere with your donation.
- The 2024 receipts for charitable donations will still be issued by COUC in late January as normal. For any donations received in January and February that are designated for the 2024 year, COUC will issue separate receipts for tax purposes in March. That way, those who normally file their tax returns early will not be delayed because of this extension.
- Automatic payments like monthly PAR contributions will all be recorded as 2025 contributions and cannot be reassigned to 2024.
- The books of financial record for COUC for 2024 will be kept open until after February 28<sup>th</sup> to ensure all
  contributions designated for 2024 are recorded in the proper year. While this will delay completion of our
  final 2024 Financial Statements, we should still have them in time for an Annual Congregation Meeting
  (ACM) at the end of March.

COUC will proceed with the extension, but please understand that contributions made in January and February and designated for 2024, may end up being considered 2025 donations for tax purposes if the government changes course.

### News from our Sisters & Brothers in El Salvador

Congratulations! Felicitaciones! After many years of struggle & sacrifice, Fatima Lizbeth Flores has graduated from university in El Salvador with her degree in Social Work. She persevered through two-plus years of school closures due to the pandemic and managed to keep up with classes on her phone despite the absence of WiFi in her tiny rural community of LaFlorida/El Triunfo.

The 16 high school and university students that COUC has sponsored over the past years have travelled by bus (often at 5:30 a.m.) into the city, returning in the evening, after attending classes and then searching for internet access to complete their course work. Every one of the students who we helped has gone on to support their siblings, families & their community in many ways, often working with NGO's (non-government organizations) in order to better the lives of others.

Fatima expressed the deepest gratitude to our congregation for its support and often told us about her classes and how much she enjoyed her work experiences, especially when she was working with the elderly. We have no doubt that she will contribute much over the coming years. Her mother and sister are in the graduation photo with her. (Fatima's mom works with ACUA, an organization that protects water and agriculture.)

# **Exploring the Lord's Prayer through Chi Kung**

Our facilitator is a practitioner of Level 1 Chi Kung, an ancient Chinese practice that uses movement, breathing, and meditation to improve health and well-being.

Come and explore the prayer that Christians have known as The Lord's Prayer or Prayer of Jesus, through this lens! Praying the Lord's Prayer in its original language offers the opportunity to remove ourselves from the modern world and better appreciate its beauty and intended meaning.



# **Our Facilitator:**



Fran Jasiura grew up in the United Church in Thunder Bay, Ontario, which initiated a lifetime search for spiritual practice and connection. She left the church for 16 years as she immersed herself in Verdant meditation with bi-yearly retreats in India and a mediation centre and teacher there. Returning to her Hebraic-Christian roots through several retreats and study with a Kabbalist teacher, Fran became a licensed Spiritual Director through the Prairie Jubilee Program in 2008.

Fran was the co-founder of Change Talk Associates that offered training with health care providers across Canada in Motivational Interviewing to help them strengthen their skills in empathic listening and guiding conversations of change. Fran has been facilitating a small regular group of women in the Aramaic Chi Kung practice on Monday mornings at Winfield United Church for two years. Participants express ongoing gratitude - to return to their childhood faith with fresh ears, and for deepening their faith and practice in ongoing community.




"Every young person deserves safety, dignity, and the chance to build a future," Jeremy Welder, CEO of BGC Okanagan said in a press release.
