INTERNATIONAL PIPE ORGAN DAY AT COUC April 26th

RCCO (Royal Canadian College of Organists) Victoria members Andrew Fraser and Sandra Fletcher were warmly welcomed by the staff and members of Central Okanagan United Church in Kelowna, BC. This year they are celebrating the 100th anniversary of their Casavant organ (opus 1096), as well as the centenary of the inauguration of the United Church of Canada. About 50 people attended the event on Saturday afternoon, with 20 people playing the organ.

Among the visitors were children who were extremely excited about playing the organ, piano students, the grandson of an organ technician who had worked for the Casavant Freres company, pianists, former organists and organ students. The Kelowna Historical Society also set up a display in the church hall to talk about the history of the churches in Kelowna. Andrew Fraser took time to explain how the organ functions and had several pipes on hand to show to the participants.













Outreach Updates:

We all know that the numbers do not tell the whole story but they do explain a lot, especially when people who previously volunteered on Tuesday mornings are trying to understand what is currently happening on Tuesday mornings with regard to the number of people we are serving.



In January 2023 we distributed an average of 27 bags of groceries each week but by year end we were averaging 60. By the end of 2024 it was 96, and the number continues to increase with 142 bags distributed on April 15th.

The numbers fluctuate weekly and the only real exception was the big drop on Christmas Eve 2024. We debated whether to open that day as we

expected most people would not come, and our numbers did drop by about 50%, but the 50+ people who showed up really appreciated being able to get their groceries before the holidays.

How does this compare to what other groups are experiencing? Well, the Central Okanagan Food Bank reported a 43% increase in clients during 2024, and our increase in grocery bags distributed in 2024 is about 60%, with new immigrants being a major part of our increase.

The need is great and the need is growing, but so far we are managing to keep up with the demand and that is thanks to all of you who support the Tuesday morning grocery program with donations of money or groceries or even just a word of encouragement. And of course, our Food Pantry volunteers are an incredibly dedicated and hard-working group of individuals.

Our meal program continues to grow at the same rate as the grocery distribution. So far this year we have averaged 111 meals per week, with numbers fluctuating from 96 to 133. Our cooks, sandwich makers and incredible kitchen volunteers do a remarkable job of feeding the crowd each week. A special thank you goes to the Friday Evening Women's Group who at their February gathering made enough meatloaf to feed over 100 people!

Thank you everyone for your support of the Tuesday morning Outreach program!!!

<u>Stewardship</u>

Today we are invited to live into this same Easter generosity as an act of faith rooted in resurrection hope. Giving is more than a line in a church financial budget. Giving is a communal act of holy participation in God's unfolding story of healing, justice, and renewal.

To give is to participate. To give is to proclaim that we are not alone. To give is to sing that we are connected to all our relations. To give is to state that we believe in life beyond death, in love beyond limits.

It is about responding to Christ's invitation to love our neighbours, walk with global partners, and share in resurrection hope that defies despair. Every gift becomes a witness to our belief that love can transform lives.

As the 100th anniversary of the United Church of Canada approaches on June 10, 2025 we have much to celebrate as a denomination and as a congregation! We are looking forward to an exciting future that involves building and property redevelopment at our two sites in downtown Kelowna and Rutland.

This verbal report was presented at the Congregation's Annual Meeting, April 06, 2025 by the Redevelopment Committee

Members of the current Central Okanagan United Church congregation, who were formerly members of the First United congregation, will remember the FirstUp process. Many members of the congregation were involved as well as consultants. A concept for the Bernard site was presented to the congregation in December of 2019 and was very well received.

The process was unfortunately interrupted by COVID and then the amalgamation of the four churches followed. A benefit of the FirstUp process is significant background information on the challenges that the Bernard site presents. However, the cost estimates are out of date and the concept needs to be updated to reflect the needs of the amalgamated congregation.

Fortunately we have had a very committed Property Team working to ensure that necessary maintenance and repairs to the Bernard and Rutland sites are being undertaken. There is a report from this committee in the Annual Report package.

A new committee has begun working to develop a strategy for both the Rutland and Bernard sites. The "do nothing" option cannot be considered any longer.

Meetings have been held with representatives of the Pacific Mountain Region to determine the region's position on any proposals that might be developed. The Region's position does not support the sale of church property.

The future of the Metis housing proposal for a portion of Rutland site is not known as the current agreements have expired.

The committee recently met and determined that a better understanding is needed of the financial resources available for any major redevelopment and/or renovations. This is being investigated, will be key in determining our options, and includes potential revenue from either the sale or lease of the Rutland site. Given the current situation, it is important that the congregation be aware of the following:

- Any new redevelopment/renovation proposals will take time to plan, approve and implement.
- The Bernard site (being most urgent) will be the focus.
- Any proposals will have to reflect the broader needs of the COUC amalgamated congregation.
- Depending on the details of a final solution to moving forward, we can expect the Bernard site to be unavailable for an extended period of time. Alternative off site space may be required for (worship and) church programs.






TEA, COFFEE AND CONVERSATION


Walking the Labyrinth
